The Gibson County Board of Commissioners met in regular session April 17, 2007, at 9 AM in the North Annex Meeting Room.

The meeting was called to order with all present standing for a moment of silence for the victims and families of the Virginia Tech Massacre. After which the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous meeting of April 3, 2007, were approved with a motion by Whitehead seconded Townsend and passed 3-0.

Claims: The following claims were presented for approval: Utilities, \$15,352.70; Payroll, \$288,271.21. The claims were approved with a motion by Townsend seconded by Townsend and passed 3-0.

Sheriff: George Ballard brought a speed limit request for CR 750S east of US Hwy 41 of 40 MPH. This request was approved with a motion by Whitehead seconded by Townsend and passed 3-0.

Triad Mining: Scott Partenheimer representing the mining company brought to the Board an amendment to the agreement on CR 50N to include shoulder improvement proposal. The agreement was approved with the condition of INDOT approval with a motion by Townsend seconded by Whitehead and passed 3-0.

New Business: Tara Schmitt, Karen Ellerman and Chris Hayes, downtown Princeton merchants asked the Board to consider removing the elected officials parking lot from the west side of the Courthouse and restrict Courthouse employees from parking around the square.

Leonard Harbison asked if there was anything that the County could do to get the owners of Maple Hill Cemetery to maintain the grounds. There was discussion on this subject and that it will be looked into by the Commissioners.

Having no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Townsend seconded by Whitehead and passed 3-0.
