The Gibson County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on March 4, 2008, at 9 AM in the North Annex Meeting Room.

The meeting was called to order with all present standing to have a moment of silence in honor of the Korean War Veteran who was presented with the Metal of Honor and in support of all of the Armed Forces. After the moment of silence the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes of the previous meeting of February 19, 2008, were approved with a motion by Townsend seconded by Whitehead and passed 3-0.

Approval of Claims: The following claims were submitted for approval: Payroll, 2/29/08, \$281,915.37; Highway, \$277,699.24; County General, \$78,890.32; Sheriff, \$65,076.84. The claims were approved with a motion by Whitehead seconded by Townsend and passed 3-0.

Department Reports: Safety: Ken Greubel reported that during the ice storm that 7 employees fell six are fine, one will require surgery and there was one vehicle accident but it was just a slide over, no injury.

EMA: Terry Hedges announced that the week of March 2-8 is National Preparedness Week with a daily schedule for events. He also stated that on March 8th from 9 AM to noon there will be a weather spotter training session.

Veterans Service: Barbara Schencks distributed and gave her monthly report.

Sheriff: Allen Harmon asked for a six week medical leave for an employee. The leave was granted with a motion by Whitehead seconded by Townsend and passed 3-0. He gave a report on the jail, work release and replacement of the dispatch equipment. He stated that he hoped that the E-911 fund would be able to pay for most of the expense.

Highway: Jerry Heldt gave a report on the expenses of the resent storms. He stated that the bids for bridge 398 are to be let on April 18th by the State. These bids will cover the new bridge and the rehabilitation of the old bridge. The old bridge will be rehabilitated because it is deemed an historical bridge by the DNR and has to be preserved.
