
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
Commissioner Whitehead and County Attorney James McDonald were present for the 10 AM meeting to open the bids concerning the new jail controls.


McDonald opened the two bids received: Stanley Convergent Security Solutions, Inc., base bid of \$251,860.00 with a 2 year warranty for \$13,680.00; South Western Communications, base bid of \$284,000.00 with a 2 year warranty for \$25,333.00.

The bids were taken under advisement for further study hoping to be able to award the bid at the August 4<sup>th</sup> meeting. Mark Clark representing DieBolt presented a letter for each Commissioner. After opening his letter, Whitehead asked Mr. Clark about his concerns. Clark stated that the company had concerns about some of the requirements of the specifications that would restrict companies from submitting a bid. It was stated that these requirements were included to allow availability of parts when needed for repair and a reasonable response time by a qualified repair person.
