The Gibson County Board of Commissioners met in Special Session on May 19th, 2015, at 4:00 PM at the North Annex Meeting Room.

Members Present: Included President Stephen E. Bottoms, Vice-President Gerald Bledsoe, Commissioner Alan Douglas, Administrative Assistant Kay Vore, County Attorney James McDonald III, and 1st Deputy Marilyn Mason.

Absent: County Auditor Sherri Smith was attending the Auditor’s Conference in Indianapolis. .

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Welcome were recited and led by President Bottoms.

Old Business:


Water and Wastewater Feasibility Study for the Gibson County I-69 Corridor was the topic of the meeting.

- Chris Kaufman with Beam, Longest and Neff LLC presented a plan for long term water and wastewater infrastructure needs along the I69 Corridor in Gibson County. Each City or Town along the corridor will be given equal opportunity. The three interchanges in Gibson County are SR 68, SR 168, and SR 64. Gibson County is the only County along I69 to have three interchanges.
- The cost of the lift station at the SR 64 intersection could range between \$2.3 and \$3.6 million. The service would be from Francisco and or Oakland City.
- The estimated cost of sewer service to the SR 168 interchange is \$9.8 million.
- The estimated cost for SR 68 interchange is \$4.0 million.
- These plans should also help the surrounding homeowners connect to a sewer system.


The companies or organizations that have given money for the study are Win Energy-REMC, Gibson County Economic Development, Pike Gibson Water, Francisco, and Sigeco. Grant money is being pursued to help in the cost of these projects.

With no further business, Commissioner Bledsoe adjourned the meeting, seconded by Commissioner Douglas. Motion carried 3-0.


