placements. He stated that there is a class action suit concerning this model of which the County is participating in hopes of recovering at least part of the expense of the extensive repairs. Townsend suggested that they use Bid Bridge to do the work on acquiring a new ambulance. This is a firm from Louisville, KY, that does all the bid taking and negotiations for a new ambulance and the awarded company pays the expense of the process. After discussion a motion to approve the purchase of a new ambulance and to use Bid Bridge to do so was made by Whitehead seconded by Bledsoe and passed 3-0.
County owned house demolition: a house at 212 N. Gibson Street, Princeton, is in need of demolition and is owned by the County due to nonpayment of property taxes. It was decided that John Umpliby, County Engineer, would inspect the property and report back as to what would be required for the demolition.

A question of what the process is to have grass cut on property within the county. Attorney McDonald stated that a letter would be written to the owner to start the process and would be followed upon to resolve the problem. If the property would be within a city or town's limits, then it would have to be handled through the proper channels within that unit.

Tom Miskell expressed his concern of traffic on CR 1100 E near Mackey mostly due to coal mine traffic. Is there anything that can be done about the traffic and the dust it creates? Jerry Hedlt stated he would be in contact with the coal company and see what could be done.

Charlie Schultz asked about getting some ditch work done along the county road that runs from the Wheeling Bridge to Mt. Tabor.

Having no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Bledsoe seconded by Whitehead and passed 3-0.
