
Gibson County Council
Regular Session
April 12th, 2016

The Gibson County Council met in Regular Session on April 12th, 2016 at 9:00 AM at the North Annex Meeting Room.

Members Present: Included President Jeremy Overton, Vice-President Derek McGraw, Councilman Craig Pflug, William McConnell, George Ankenbrand, Dan Beard, Jay Riley and Sherri Smith, Gibson County Auditor.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited and led by President Overton.

Judge Meade discussed a Grant Request – Councilman McGraw made a motion to approve and appropriate a Gal Casa State Capacity Building Grant totaling \$14,284.82, seconded by Councilman Riley. With no further discussion, the Motion carried 7-0.

Approval of Minutes – Minutes of the March 8, 2016 Regular Meeting and the March 24, 2016 Special Meeting were approved as written with Council consensus.

Housekeeping

- Amend Motion made at last meeting regarding the new position of Fleet (Parts) Manager

Councilman Pflug made a motion to amend a motion made at the March meeting to remove the position of Parts Runner from the Highway Maintenance and Repair Budget and instead move the amount appropriated in the Parts Runner line to Heavy Equipment Operator, seconded by Councilman Riley. With no further discussion, the Motion carried 7-0.

Department Reports

Sheriff Tim Bottoms presented the monthly reports. He also asked for Council permission to replace an E911 operator that resigned. Council consensus was given.

EMS Director Jim Allen presented the monthly report.

EMA Director Terry Hedges asked for Council permission to spend \$5,000 from one of the reimbursable Homeland Security Grants. Councilman McGraw made a motion to allow the \$5,000 expenditure, seconded by Councilman Beard. With no further discussion, the Motion carried 7-0.

Purdue Extension Office Director Hans Schmitz presented the monthly report.

Council President Overton informed everyone that he and other County officials spoke at the Legislative Update meeting. He passed out copies of his report to everyone showing the amount of County funds available.

Old Business

- Motion was made at the March Council meeting to advertise to de-appropriate the Judge's Supplemental salary and the following amounts from the 2016 budget: \$2,739 from fund 1000 County General – Prosecutor Personal Services; \$5,000 from County General – Circuit Court Personal Services; \$5,000 from County General – Superior Court Personal Services; totaling \$12,739; and \$3,750 from 2502 Prosecutor Deferral User Fee Personal Services; and \$2,261 from 8897 Prosecutor IV-D Incentive Personal Services. Councilman Ankenbrand made a motion to approve the de appropriation and send the necessary paperwork to DLGF, seconded by Councilman McConnell. With no further discussion, the Motion carried 5-2 with Councilmen McGraw and Riley voting no.
- 2016 Salary Ordinance
 - Decision on Comp Time – Auditor Smith informed the Council that some changes are coming from the federal government concerning overtime and comp time. The County has at least two employees that this may affect and the Council will look into the problem of paying the overtime that is currently being turned in.
- 2016-2017 EDIT Plan – Commissioner Bottoms requested that this be moved to May.
- Councilman McConnell spoke to the Council and the public about some ideas to help the cities and towns of the County with their water problems.


New Business

- EMS Full Time Employee – The Council asked Jim Allen to get some information together to substantiate the need for a second full time person in the EMS office.

EMS requested a Transfer – Councilman Pflug made a motion to transfer \$18,000 from 1000-47-02-21 Diesel Fuel/Gasoline to 1000-47-04-04 New Ambulance, seconded by Councilman McGraw. With no further discussion, the Motion carried 7-0.
- Commissioner Bottoms named several projects for which the Economic Development Commission has supplied funds. Commissioner Bottoms asked the Council for \$8,000 to pave the elected official's parking lot. The Auditor's Office will look into the possibility of using the Cum Building Fund for this project. It will be discussed at the next meeting.
- County resident Charlie Shultz spoke to the Council about money coming into the County.

Councilman McGraw made a motion to adjourn the meeting.
