Regular Session
May 12, 2015

The Gibson County Council met in Regular Session on May 12, 2015, at 9:00 AM at the North Annex Meeting Room.

Members Present: Included President Jeremy Overton, Councilmen Craig Pflug, William McConnell, George Ankenbrand, Dan Beard, and Jay Riley and Sherri Smith, Gibson County Auditor.

Members Absent: Councilman Derek McGraw

Open with Pledge

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited and led by President Overton.

Approval of Minutes: The Minutes from the April 21st, 2015 Regular Council Meeting were approved as read.

Department Reports

The Auditor's Office reported that the 2016 Budget Worksheets have been distributed to all departments.

Gibson County Health Administrator Kelly Kelley introduced Judy Adams as the newest employee at the Health Department. The Council welcomed her.

EMS Director Jim Allen presented the monthly report.

Captain Deborah Borchelt with the Sheriff's Department presented the monthly report.

Old Business

- 2015 Salary Ordinance Revision – Councilman Pflug made a motion to approve the 2015 Amended Salary Ordinance, seconded by Councilman McConnell. With no further discussion, the motion carried 6-0.
- Councilman McConnell informed everyone that at the next meeting he will present a spending proposal for the County.
- Councilman Pflug stated that at the budget meetings for 2015 budget, it was decided that and stated in the 2015 Salary Ordinance that any new employee hired in 2015 would start at a \$1,000 less than the base salary with a \$500 increase at six months and another \$500

increase at 12 months bringing them to full salary. This change was to be discussed with the Union by Commissioner Douglas. A Highway employee was hired this year and is being paid 100% of their base salary and not according to the Salary Ordinance.


- Rust Problem in Corrections Center Restrooms – Tim Dutkiewicz with Midwest Roofing and Sheet Metal presented a plan to fix the rust problems in the bathrooms in the Work Release Center. The price is \$24,300.00. This work will take about two weeks. Councilman Pflug made a motion to advertise an additional appropriation of \$24,300 in the Cum Building Fund, seconded by Councilman Ankenbrand. With no further discussion, the motion carried 6-0.
- Commissioner Bottoms informed the Council that the Commissioners are getting proposals to do repair on the third floor of the Courthouse. The cost of repair will possibly be paid from EDIT.

New Business

- Health Dept. requests Transfer – Councilman Riley made a motion to approve the transfer of \$735.00 from 9101-02-02-60 Tobacco Prevention & Cessation Supplies AND \$133.87 from 9101-03-03-13 TP&C Travel for a total of \$868.87 into 9101-03-03-17 TP&C Advertising, seconded by Councilman Ankenbrand. With no further discussion, the motion carried 6-0. This is to pay for advertising invoices in the TP&C program.
- Commissioner Bottoms spoke to the Council about asking the Redevelopment Commission for the use of TIF money for new Sheriff's vehicles, a new ambulance, and updating communication radios. Councilman Overton stated that he would like some facts to present in order to ask for TIF money. A special meeting may be needed to continue this process.

Councilman Beard made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Ankenbrand. Motion carried 6-0.


