The Gibson County Council met in Regular Session on September 09, 2014, at 9:00 AM at the North Annex Meeting Room.

Members Present: President Jeremy Overton, Vice-President Craig Pflug, Councilwoman LeAnn Smith, Councilman Bill McConnell, Tony Wolfe, George Ankenbrand, Derek McGraw and Sherri Smith, Gibson County Auditor

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited and led by President Overton.

Approval of Minutes

August 5th, 2014 Regular Meeting, August 18th, 2014 Special Meeting, August 18th, 2014 Budget Discussion, and August 28th, 2014 1st Budget Hearing minutes were approved as read.

Department Reports

EMS Director Dan Alvey presented the monthly report for August.

Health Administrator Kelly Kelley presented the monthly report. They will be giving the flu vaccine to County employees, and going elsewhere in the County to do this, also. Permission was given to pay for the employee flu vaccines out of the self-insurance fund.

Sheriff George Ballard presented the monthly report. Several inmates are on work release. At the current time, there are no left turns at the junction of SR64 and SR65.

Commissioner Douglas gave an update on the employee situation at the Highway garage.

Old Business

No old business discussed.

New Business

- Transfer Request from EMA Director Alvey - Councilman Pflug made a motion to approve a transfer for the EMS Department for \$20,000 from 47-01-14 – Full Time Paramedics to 47-01-16 – Part Time Paramedics, seconded by Councilwoman Smith. Motion carried 7-0.

- Transfer Request from Clerk Becky Woodburn - Councilman Ankenbrand made a motion to approve a transfer in the Clerk's budget for \$50.71 from 1000-01-02-11 – Office Supplies to 1000-01-03-81 – Xerox Rentals, seconded by Councilwoman Smith. Motion carried 7-0.
- Additional Appropriation Request from Judge Meade - Councilman Ankenbrand made a motion to approve an additional appropriation in 1213 – Gal/Casa for \$2,000 for line item 1213-02-01-01 – CASA Operations, seconded by Councilwoman Smith. Motion carried 7-0.
- 2nd Amendment to GC Police Retirement Plan - Councilman Wolfe made a motion to approve a 2nd Amendment to the Gibson County Police Retirement Plan with some IRS wording added to it, seconded by Councilman Ankenbrand. Motion carried 7-0. These changes will be of no cost to the County.
- Councilman Wolfe thanked the Employers of the County that hire the inmates in the Work Release Program. Sheriff George Ballard stated that Amy Ellis, an employee of Community Corrections, works really hard to place these inmates in employment.
- Sheriff makes a request for Body Cameras - Councilman Wolfe made a motion to approve the purchase of body cameras for the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$28,600 to be paid out of the Riverboat Fund #1191, seconded by Councilman Ankenbrand. Motion carried 7-0.
- Redevelopment Commission Appointee - Councilman McGraw made a motion to approve Bruce McIntosh as the Council's Appointment to the Gibson County Redevelopment Committee, seconded by Councilman Wolfe. Motion carried 6-0 with Councilman McConnell abstaining.
- Parks Board Appointee - Councilman Wolfe made a motion to appoint Shea Phillips and Preston Richardt to the Gibson County Parks Board, seconded by Councilman Pflug. Motion carried 7-0.
- Prosecutor's Office Part Time Clerical Replacement - Council approval was given to Prosecutor Rob Krieg to replace a part time person in the Prosecutor's Office.
- It was decided to discuss the GIS budget issue at the budget session following the Council Meeting.

Councilman McGraw made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Ankenbrand. Motion carried 7-0.
